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Assembling

Unpack




Insert the SIM or USIM card and battery

When you subscribe to a cellular service, you will receive a Subscriber Identity Module (SIM) card, with subscription details, such as your personal identification number (PIN) and optional services. To use UMTS or HSDPA services, you can purchase a Universal Subscriber Identity Module (USIM) card.

To install the SIM or USIM card and battery,

Remove the back cover.



2 Insert the SIM or USIM card.



- Place the SIM or USIM card into the device with the gold-colored contacts facing down.
 - If you do not insert a SIM or USIM card, you can only use your device's non-network services and some menus.



3 Insert the battery.



4 Replace the back cover.



Charge the battery

Before using the device for the first time, you must charge the battery.

You can charge the device with the provided travel adapter or by connecting the device to a PC with a PC data cable.



Use only Samsung-approved chargers and cables. Unauthorized chargers or cables can cause batteries to explode or damage your device.

- When your battery is low, the device will emit a warning tone and display a low battery message. The battery icon C! will also be empty and blinking. If the battery level becomes too low, the device will automatically power off. Recharge your battery to continue using your device.
 - When the device is too hot to charge, charging is stopped and the icon ← is shown. Charging will be continued only after the device is moderate.



> Charge with the travel adapter

- 1 Open the cover to the multifunction jack on the side of the device.
- 2 Plug the small end of the travel adapter into the device.





Improperly connecting the travel adapter can cause serious damage to the device. Any damage caused by misuse is not covered by the warranty.

- 3 Plug the large end of the travel adapter into a power outlet.
 - You can use the device while it is charging, but it may take longer to fully charge the battery.
 - While charging, the device may heat up. This is normal and should not affect your device's lifespan or performance.
 - If your device is not charging properly, bring your device and the charger to a Samsung Service Centre.
- When the battery is fully charged (the battery icon is no longer moving), unplug the travel adapter from the device and then from the power outlet.
 - Do not remove the battery before removing the travel adapter. Doing this may cause damage to the device.
- 5 Close the cover the cover to the multifunction jack.



Insert a memory card (optional)

By inserting a memory card, you can store multimedia files and messages or back up your important information. Your device accepts microSD™ or microSDHC™ memory cards up to 32 GB (depending on memory card manufacturer and type).



Samsung uses approved industry standards for memory cards, but some brands may not be fully compatible with your device. Using an incompatible memory card may damage your device or the memory card and can corrupt data stored on the card.



- Your device supports only the FAT file structure for memory cards. If you insert a card formatted with a different file structure, your device will ask you to reformat the memory card.
- Frequent writing and erasing will shorten the lifespan of memory cards.

- Open the cover to the memory card slot on the side of the device.
- 2 Insert the memory card with the gold-colored contacts facing down.



- 3 Push the memory card in the memory card slot until it locks in place.
- 4 Close the cover to the memory card slot.



> Remove the memory card

- $\ensuremath{\underline{I}}$ $\ensuremath{\mathsf{Open}}$ the cover to the memory card slot on the side of the device.
- $2 \,\,$ Push the memory card gently until it disengages from the device.
- *3* Pull the memory card out of the memory card slot.
- 4 Close the cover to the memory card slot.
 - Do not remove a memory card while the device is transferring or accessing information, as this could result in loss of data or damage to the memory card or device.



Getting started

Turn your device on and off

To turn on your device,

- Press and hold [Dec].
- 2 Follow the on-screen instructions. Your device will automatically connect to the cellular network.

Follow all posted warnings and directions from official personnel when in areas where the use of wireless devices is restricted, such as airplanes and hospitals.

To turn off your device, repeat step 1 above.

> Reset your device

You can reset your device by pressing and holding the Power key for about eight to ten seconds.



Getting started

> Lock or unlock the keys

You can lock the keys to prevent any unwanted device operations from accidentally pressing any of the keys. To lock the keys, press and hold [$\lim_{k \to \infty}$].

To unlock, press and hold $[L_{ukk}^{LMK}]$ or press $\langle Unlock \rangle \rightarrow [*]$.

> Disable wireless functions

By disabling your device's wireless functions, you can use non-network services in areas where wireless devices are prohibited, such as airplanes and hospitals. To disable wireless functions,

On the Home screen, press $[\bigcup_{k=1}^{max}] \rightarrow$ **Wireless Manager**.

2 Select Phone.

Your device will show Ψ_x on the Home screen.


3 Press <**Done**>.

To enable wireless functions, repeat steps 1-3 above.

Access menus

Learn to open applications or folders and switch between open applications.

> Open applications or folders

- I On the Home screen, press <Start> to access the Start menu.
- 2 Select an application or folder.

To use the Home screen shortcuts, on the Home screen, press the Navigation key left or right to move among the shortcuts or menus.

Switch applications

Your device allows you to multi-task by running multiple applications at the same time. To switch from one active application to another,

Press and hold [础] to open Task Manager. Task Manager shows a list of all open applications.

2 Select an application to switch to the application.

> Close applications

To send the current application to the background, press [\mathfrak{D}].

To close an application,

- / Press and hold [础] to open **Task Manager**.
- 2 Scroll to an application and press <End Task>. To close all applications, press <Menu> \rightarrow End All Tasks \rightarrow <Yes>.

Customize your device

Get more from your phone by customizing it to match your preferences.



> Set the current time and date

- $\ensuremath{\underline{l}}$ From the Start menu, select Settings \rightarrow Date and Time.
- 2 Set the time zone and enter the current date and time.
- 3 Press <**Done**>.
- > Change your Home screen layout or background image
- 2 Select a layout under Home screen layout.
- *3* Select an image under **Background image**.
- 4 When you are finished, press <**Done**>.

> Adjust the system volume

To adjust the system volume, press the Volume key up or down.

> Switch to the silent mode

On the Home screen, press and hold [-----] to mute or unmute your device.

> Set up sounds

- *[* From the Start menu, select **Settings** \rightarrow **Sounds**.
- 2 Select **Ringtone** or **Other Sounds**.
- Customize the sound options for incoming calls, incoming messages, and other device sounds.

- 4 When you are finished, press <**Done**>.



> Lock your device

You can lock your device by activating the device password.

- $2 \;$ Select the check box next to Prompt if phone unused for.
- β Select the length of time the device waits before locking itself.
- 4 Select a password type under **Password type**.
- 5 Enter a new password under **Password**, and then enter the new password again under **Confirm password**.
- 6 Press $\langle Done \rangle \rightarrow \langle Yes \rangle$.

Once the device lock is enabled, you must enter the password after a specified length of time when you do not use the device or each time you turn on the device.



- If you forget your password, bring your device to a Samsung Service Centre to unlock it.
- Samsung is not responsible for any loss of passwords or private information or other damages caused by illegal software.

Lock your SIM or USIM card

You can lock your device by activating the PIN supplied with your SIM or USIM card.

- $\begin{array}{ll} \mbox{From the Start menu, select Settings} \rightarrow \mbox{More...} \rightarrow \\ \mbox{Security} \rightarrow \mbox{Enable SIM PIN}. \end{array}$
- 2 Enter the PIN of your SIM or USIM card.
- 3 Press <**Done**>.

Once the PIN lock is enabled, you must enter the PIN each time you turn on the device or to use features supplied by the SIM or USIM card.



- Ø
- If you enter an incorrect PIN 3 times, your SIM or USIM card will be blocked. You must enter a PIN unlock key (PUK) to unblock the SIM or USIM card.
- If you block your SIM or USIM card by entering an incorrect PUK, bring the card to your service provider to unblock it.

> Activate the mobile tracker

When someone inserts a new SIM or USIM card in your device, the mobile tracker feature will automatically send the contact number to specified recipients to help you locate and recover your device.

- $\begin{array}{ll} \mbox{ From the Start menu, select } \textbf{Settings} \rightarrow \textbf{More...} \rightarrow \\ \textbf{Security} \rightarrow \textbf{More...} \rightarrow \textbf{Mobile Tracker}. \end{array}$
- 2 Enter your reset password and press <**Done**>.
- *3* Select **Turn on Mobile Tracker**.

- 4 Select the recipient input field and enter a phone number including a country code (with +). To select one from the phonebook, press <Menu> → Contacts.
- 5 When you are finished entering the recipient numbers, press <**Done**>.
- 6 Select the sender input field and enter a sender's name.
- 7 Press $\langle \mathbf{Done} \rangle \rightarrow \langle \mathbf{Yes} \rangle \rightarrow \langle \mathbf{OK} \rangle$.

Access the help system

To access the help system of your device, from the Start menu, select **Getting Started** \rightarrow a help topic. The online help system appears.



Enter text

Your device is equipped with a QWERTY keyboard to support easy and quick text input. You can enter text as you would when using a computer's keyboard.

Press appropriate alphanumeric keys to enter characters, numbers, and symbols.

Communication

Calling

Learn to make and receive calls, reject calls, and adjust the call volume.

> Make a call

- 1 On the Home screen, enter an area code and phone number.
- 2 Press [_] to dial the number.

For a video call, press \langle **Menu** $\rangle \rightarrow$ **Video Call**.

- 3 To end the call, press [\mathfrak{P}].
 - Use the phonebook to save numbers you dial frequently. ► p. 46
 - To quickly access the call log to redial the numbers you dialed recently, press [___].

> Answer a call

- When a call comes in, press [🛌].
 - When the device is ringing, press the Volume key to adjust the volume.
- 2 For a video call, press <**Show me**> to allow the caller to see you via the front camera lens.
- 3 To end the call, press [\mathfrak{P}].

Reject a call

When a call comes in, press [___]. When you reject a call, the caller will hear a busy tone.



Call an international number

- I On the Home screen, press and hold [+] to insert the + character (this replaces the international access code).
- 2 Enter the complete number you want to dial (country code, area code, and phone number), and then press [\checkmark] to dial.
- 3 To end the call, press [\mathfrak{P}].

> Use the headset

By plugging the supplied headset into the device, you can make and answer calls:

- To redial the last call, press and hold the headset button.
- To answer a call, press the headset button.
- To end a call, press and hold the headset button.

The supplied headset is designed only for your device and may not be compatible with other phones and MP3 players.

> Use options during a voice call

You can use the following options while a voice call is in progress:

- To adjust the voice volume, press the Volume key up or down.
- To place a call on hold, press <**Menu**> → **Hold**. To retrieve a held call, press <**Menu**> → **Unhold**.
- To activate the speakerphone feature, press <Menu> → Speakerphone On.



- In noisy environments, you may have difficulty hearing some calls while using the speakerphone feature. For better audio performance, use the normal phone mode.
- To turn off the microphone so that the other party cannot hear you, press <**Menu** $> \rightarrow$ **Mute**.
- To dial a second call, place the first call on hold and then dial a new number.



- To answer a second call, press [] when a call waiting tone sounds. The first call is automatically placed on hold. You must subscribe to the call waiting service to use this feature.
- To listen and talk to the other party via the bluetooth headset, press <**Menu**> → **Turn Hands-free On**.
- To make a multiparty call (conference call), make or answer a second call and press <Menu> → Conference when connected to the second party. Repeat to add more parties. You must subscribe to the multiparty call service to use this feature.

> Access the call history

- *I* From the Start menu, **Call History**.

- *3* Select a call history.
 - To make a call, press <Call> or [___].
 - To delete the selected or all call histories, press <Menu> → Delete Call or Delete All Calls.

Messaging

Learn to use text and multimedia messaging functions.

> Send a text message

From the Start menu, select **Messaging** \rightarrow **SMS/MMS**.

- 2 Press < Menu $> \rightarrow$ New.
- 3 Enter a phone number or press <Menu> → Add Recipients → Contacts to select a contact.
- 4 Scroll down and enter your message text.
- 5 Press < Send> to send the message.



> Send a multimedia message

- *]* From the Start menu, select **Messaging** \rightarrow **SMS/MMS**.
- 2 Press < Menu $> \rightarrow$ New.
- 3 Enter a phone number or press <Menu> → Add Recipients → Contacts to select a contact.
- 4 Press <Menu> \rightarrow Switch to MMS.
- 5 Scroll down and enter your message text
- 6 Press \langle **Menu** $\rangle \rightarrow$ **Add** and add an item.
- $7 \;\;$ Select a file type and add an attachment.
- 9 Press <**Send**> to send the message.

View messages

You can access the message folder for all your text and multimedia messages.

To view messages,

- *]* From the Start menu, select **Messaging** \rightarrow **SMS/MMS**.
- 2 Select a message to view it.
- 3 Enter your message text.
- 4 Press <**Menu**> → **Insert** and add an item to send a multimedia message (If necessary).
- 5 Press <**Send**> to send the message.

E-mail

Learn to send or view email messages via your personal or company email account.

> Set up an email account

[From the Start menu, select Messaging \rightarrow Setup E-mail.

- Enter your email address and password and press <Next>
- To manually set up an email account, clear the check 3 box next to Try to get e-mail settings automatically from the Internet, and press <Next>.
- Select the predefined email provider, and press <Next>
- Enter your name and account name, and press <Next>.
- Enter the incoming mail server, select the account type, and press <**Next**>.
- Enter a user name and password, and press <**Next**>.
- Enter the outgoing mail server and press <**Next**>.
- g Set how often your device connects to the server and press <Finish>.

Send an email message

- From the Start menu, select Messaging.
- Select the name of an email account.
- Press \langle Menu $\rangle \rightarrow$ New.
- Enter the recipient's address in the To field or press <Menu> -> Add Recipients -> Contacts to select a contact.
- The Cc and Bcc fields are located above the sender field.
- Scroll down and enter a message subject.
- Scroll down and enter your message text.
- Press \langle **Menu** $\rangle \rightarrow$ **Insert** \rightarrow an option to attach files (if necessary).
- Press <**Send**> to send the message.

> View an email message

When you open an email account, you can view previously retrieved emails offline or connect to the email server to view new messages. After retrieving email messages, you can view them offline.

- *I* From the Start menu, **Messaging**.
- 2 Select the name of an account.
- 3 Press <Menu> → Send/Receive to download messages from your email server.
- 4 Select an email to view it.
- 5 Press <**Reply**> to reply to the message.

Messenger

With the messenger, you can remain available to other users and stay up-to-date with your email messages without a constant connection to the wireless web. When a new message arrives or you want to access internet services, the connection will be restored.

Sign in to Windows Live messenger

From the Start menu, select Messenger.

- 2 Press <Sign in>.
- 3 Press <Accept> to confirm the privacy statement (if necessary).
- 4 Enter the user ID and password of your Windows Live account and press <Next>.
- 5 Follow the on-screen instructions to complete the setup.

Chat with Windows Live messenger

From the Start menu, select Messenger.

- Locate and select a contact's name, and press < Send IM>.
- Enter a message in the text field at the bottom of the 3 screen and press <**Send**>.
- While chatting, you can perform the following actions:
 - To insert emoticons, press <Menu> → Add emoticon.
 - To transfer a file, press \langle **Menu** $\rangle \rightarrow$ **Send** \rightarrow a file type \rightarrow a file.
 - To invite a contact to chat, press <Menu> → Options → Add participant.
 - To record and send a voice clip, press < Voice clip>, record your voice, and press < Send>.
 - To switch between contact list and chat, scroll left or right.

To end the chat, press \langle **Menu** $\rangle \rightarrow$ **End conversation**.

Use other messengers

Learn to chat with friends and family from any of the instant messengers, such as Palringo.

- From the Start menu, select Palringo.
- Enter your username and password to sign in.
- Chat with friends and family instantly.

Camera

Your device allows you to take digital photos or record videos.

Capture a photo

- *I* Press and hold the Camera key to turn on the camera.
- 2 Aim the lens at the subject and make any adjustments.

> View a photo

- 3 Press the Confirm key to open it.
 While viewing a photo you can access.

While viewing a photo, you can access the following options:

- To view the photo in full screen, press <**Full Screen**>.
- To start a slide show, press <Menu> \rightarrow Play Slide Show.
- To send the photo via the messaging or Bluetooth wireless feature, press
 <code>Menu> \rightarrow Send</code> \rightarrow an option.
- To set the photo as a caller ID image or wallpaper, press <**Menu**> → **Set as** → an option.
- To delete the photo, press $<\!\!Menu\!\!> \rightarrow Delete$
- To edit the photo, press <Menu> \rightarrow Edit Image.

- To copy, move, or rename the photo, press <Menu> \rightarrow Edit \rightarrow an option.
- To view the details of the photo, press $<\!\!Menu\!\!> \rightarrow Properties.$

> Play a video

- *I* From the viewfinder, press <**View**>.
- 2 Select the video you want.Your device will automatically play the selected video.
- *3* Control the playback using the following keys:

Confirm	Pause or resume playback.
Navigation	 Left: Restart playback; Scan backward in a file (press and hold). Right: Scan forward in a file (press and hold). Up/Down: Adjust the volume.
Back/ Delete	Stop playback and return to the previous screen.
0	Switch to the full screen view.

> Adjust the camcorder settings

Before capturing a video, press <Menu> \rightarrow Settings \rightarrow Video or Setup to access the following settings:

Video Quality	Set the quality level for your videos.
Audio recording	Turn the audio on or off.
Encoding format	Select an encoding format of your video clips.
Review screen	Set the camera to switch to the review screen after capturing videos.
Zoom sound	Turn the zoom sound on or off
Brightness sound	Turn the brightness sound on or off.
Storage	Select a memory location for storing captured videos.



> Capture a series of photos

You can easily take a series of photos of moving subjects. This is useful when you are photographing children at play or a sporting event.

- I Press and hold the Camera key to turn on the camera.
- 2 Press <Menu> \rightarrow Shooting Mode \rightarrow Multi shot.
- 3 Make any necessary adjustments.
- 4 Press and hold the Camera or Confirm key to take a series of photos.
- 5 Press <**Save**> to save the photo.

> Capture photos with decorative frames

- 1 Press and hold the Camera key to turn on the camera.
- 2 Press <Menu> \rightarrow Shooting Mode \rightarrow Frame Shot.
- *\beta* Press **<Change**> \rightarrow **<List**>.
- 4 Select a frame and press the Confirm key.

- 5 Make any necessary adjustments.
- 6 Press the Camera or Confirm key to take a photo with the frame.
- 7 Press <**Save**> to save the photo.

> Create a photo mosaic

Troubleshooting

If you have trouble with your device, try these procedures before you contact a service professional.

When you turn on your device or while you are using the device, it prompts you to enter one of the following codes:

Message	Try this to solve the problem:
Password	When the phone lock feature is enabled, you must enter the password you set for the device.
PIN	When using the device for the first time or when the PIN requirement is enabled, you must enter the PIN supplied with the SIM or USIM card. You can disable this feature by using the Disable SIM PIN menu.

Message	Try this to solve the problem:
PUK	Your SIM or USIM card is blocked, usually as a result of entering your PIN incorrectly several times. You must enter the PUK supplied by your service provider.
PIN2	When you access a menu requiring the PIN2, you must enter the PIN2 supplied with the SIM or USIM card. For details, contact your service provider.

Your device does not show a signal (no bars next to the network icon)

- When you are in areas with weak signals or poor reception, you may lose reception. Move to another area and try again.
- You cannot access some options without a subscription. Contact your service provider for more details.



Calls are being dropped

When you are in areas with weak signals or poor reception, you may lose your connection to the network. Move to another area and try again.

Outgoing calls are not connected

- Ensure that you have pressed the Dial key.
- Ensure that you have accessed the right cellular network.
- Ensure that you have not set call barring for the phone number you are dialing.

Incoming calls are not connected

- Ensure that your device is turned on.
- Ensure that you have accessed the right cellular network.
- Ensure that you have not set call barring for the incoming phone number.

Others cannot hear you speaking on a call

- Ensure that you are not covering the built-in microphone.
- Ensure that the microphone is close to your mouth.
- If using a headset, ensure that it is properly connected.

Audio quality is poor

- Ensure that you are not blocking the device's internal antenna.
- When you are in areas with weak signals or poor reception, you may lose reception. Move to another area and try again.

When dialing from contacts, the call is not connected

- Ensure that the correct number is stored in the contact list.
- Re-enter and save the number, if necessary.



• Ensure that you have not set call barring for the contact's phone number.

The device beeps and the battery icon has an exclamation mark

Your battery is low. Recharge or replace the battery to continue using the device.

The battery does not charge properly or the device turns off

- The battery terminals may be dirty. Wipe both goldcolored contacts with a clean, soft cloth and try charging the battery again.
- If the battery will no longer charge completely, dispose of the old battery properly and replace it with a new battery (refer to your local ordinances for proper disposal instructions).

Your device is hot to the touch

When you use applications that require more power or use applications on your device for an extended period of time, your device may feel hot to the touch. This is normal and should not affect your device's lifespan or performance.

Error messages appear when launching the camera

Your Samsung mobile device must have sufficient available memory and battery power to operate the camera application. If you receive error messages when launching the camera, try the following:

- Charge the battery or replace it with a battery that is fully charged.
- Free some memory by transferring files to a PC or deleting files from your device.
- Restart the device. If you are still having trouble with the camera application after trying these tips, contact a Samsung Service Center.

Error messages appear when launching the FM radio

The FM radio application on your Samsung mobile device uses the headset cable as an antenna. Without a headset connected, the FM radio will be unable to receive radio stations. To use the FM radio, first ensure that the headset is properly connected. Next, scan for and save the available radio stations.

If you still cannot use the FM radio after performing these steps, try accessing your desired station with another radio receiver. If you can hear the station with another receiver, your device may require service. Contact a Samsung Service Center.

Error messages appear when opening music files

Some music files may not play on your Samsung mobile device for a variety of reasons. If you receive error messages when opening music files on your device, try the following:

- Free some memory by transferring files to a PC or deleting files from your device.
- Ensure that the music file is not Digital Rights Management (DRM)-protected. If the file is DRMprotected, ensure that you have the appropriate license or key to play the file.
- Ensure that your device supports the file type.

Another Bluetooth device is not located

- Ensure that the Bluetooth wireless feature is activated on your device.
- Ensure that the Bluetooth wireless feature is activated on the device you wish to connect to, if necessary.
- Ensure that your device and the other Bluetooth device are within the maximum Bluetooth range (10 meters).

If the tips above do not solve the problem, contact a Samsung Service Center.

A connection is not established when you connect the device to a PC

- Ensure that the PC data cable you are using is compatible with your device.
- Ensure that you have the proper drivers installed and updated on your PC.

Your device freezes or has fatal errors

If your device freezes or hangs, you may need to close programs or reset the device to regain functionality. If your device is still responsive but a program is frozen, close the program using the task manager.

If this does not solve the problem, perform a hard reset. From the Start menu mode, select **Settings** \rightarrow **More...** \rightarrow **Security** \rightarrow **More...** \rightarrow **Master Clear**.
